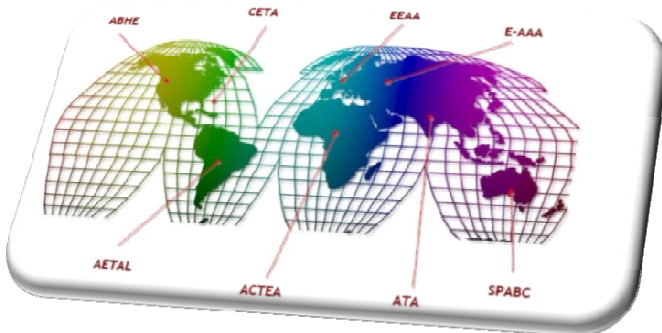
The theme will be: "Energising Community: Theological Education's Relational Mandate". The topics will include:
